



Hard Truths: Prize-winning Photography from The New York Times

Beyond Borders has curated a series of events related to 'Hard Truths: Prizewinning Photography from the New York Times' in Edinburgh and the Scottish Borders, kick-starting a global conversation in Scotland this summer.

Through 60 haunting photographs, the exhibition bears witness to the massive social and political upheaval tearing through the world, from Venezuela, Cuba, and the Philippines, to Iran and Iraq. The exhibition is a powerful tool, an insight into global turmoil by dedicated journalists who have, in many cases, risked their lives to bring back vivid eye-witness accounts from the world's front lines.

The events result from a collaboration between Beyond Borders and The New York Times, the Foundation for the Exhibition of Photography, photographer Arthur Ollman, The New York Times international picture editor David Furst, and the London School of Economics.
